## RULES

1. All entries must be in the marquee by **6PM for judging at 7PM on Friday evening 10<sup>th</sup> July**. Entries arriving in marquee on the Thursday or Friday are left at your own risk. Exhibits must remain until 4.00pm on show day. Access to the marquee is prohibited while judging is in progress.
2. Competition labels will be available in the flower marquee on Thursday & Friday but can be collected during show week from Lybster Post Office. One label for each entry. These labels bearing the name and address of competitor, section and class of entry must be securely attached to each exhibit. It is not sufficient to place labels under vases. Note the name and address must be sealed prior to judging. Children’s age to be shown on label.
3. The Society will not be responsible for any damage or loss to accessories belonging to competitors.
4. Accessories may be used unless otherwise stipulated but should not dominate the arrangement. Buds showing colour are classified as flowers. Please follow the dimension restrictions when stipulated, entries must not exceed these. Poor quality, dead or unconditioned materials may be penalised.
5. Have a Go Section (Open) open to competitors over 16 who have not entered classes 25 -32.
6. The decision of the judges will in all cases be final. Any protest by exhibitors must be lodged in writing, with any flower steward in marquee by 3.00pm on the day of the show.
7. Points are awarded for the first four placings in each class.
8. Entry is free. Prize money will only be awarded in the children’s classes.
9. Rosettes will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th prizes in all sections.
10. Competitor may not enter more than 2 exhibits in each class.
11. Pot plants must be in competitor’s possession for minimum of 2 months.
12. Artificially coloured/dyed flowers are not permitted unless otherwise stated.
